Principal's Message

The 2007-08 school year showed a great deal of progress at Franklin Pierce High School. There were a number of changes that came at the beginning of the year; this included a new principal and 15 new teachers. The new and veteran staff worked diligently throughout the school year to improve the learning experiences for all students. The school improvement plan was focused in two areas: improving academic achievement in reading, writing, math and science and improving school culture and respect. Many new programs were put into place to help students learn. Some of these included a Reading Intervention class. This class used a research-based computer program to aid students in bringing their reading achievement up to grade level. On the mathematics forefront, teachers spent numerous hours working collaboratively to establish clear learning targets and develop common assessments for the algebra and geometry curriculum.

The second initiative focused on improving school culture. A committee was formed to look at the procedures and protocols from the Safe and Civil Schools Initiative. This committee worked throughout the year in developing new strategies to address some of the school-wide concerns around attendance and tardies, in particular. By using data and researching best practices, they made suggestions to all staff in regard to some new procedures that would provide for a better learning environment for all students. These suggestions were approved by the general staff and have been implemented in the current school year. The Safe and Civil Committee will continue its work in the 2008-09 school year.

We were excited about the successes that Franklin Pierce High School had this year that included an increase in WASL scores in all areas—reading, writing, math and science. We look forward to continuing much of the work that was started in the 2007-08 as we move ahead in our quest to become a high performing high school. Our vision is simple—Prepare all students to be successful, productive citizens who have the academic preparation to succeed in post-secondary education.

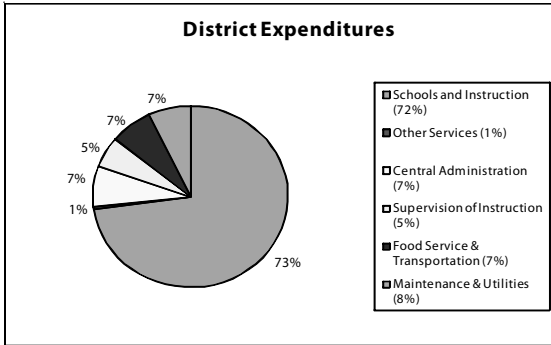

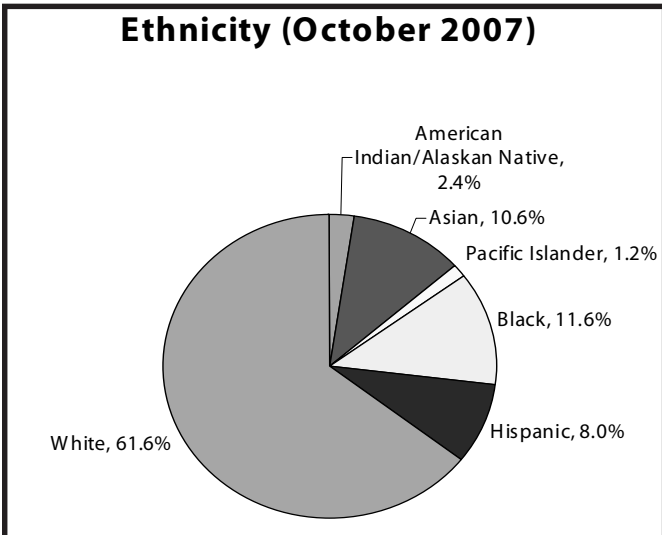
Graduation & Dropout Rates

Disciplinary Actions

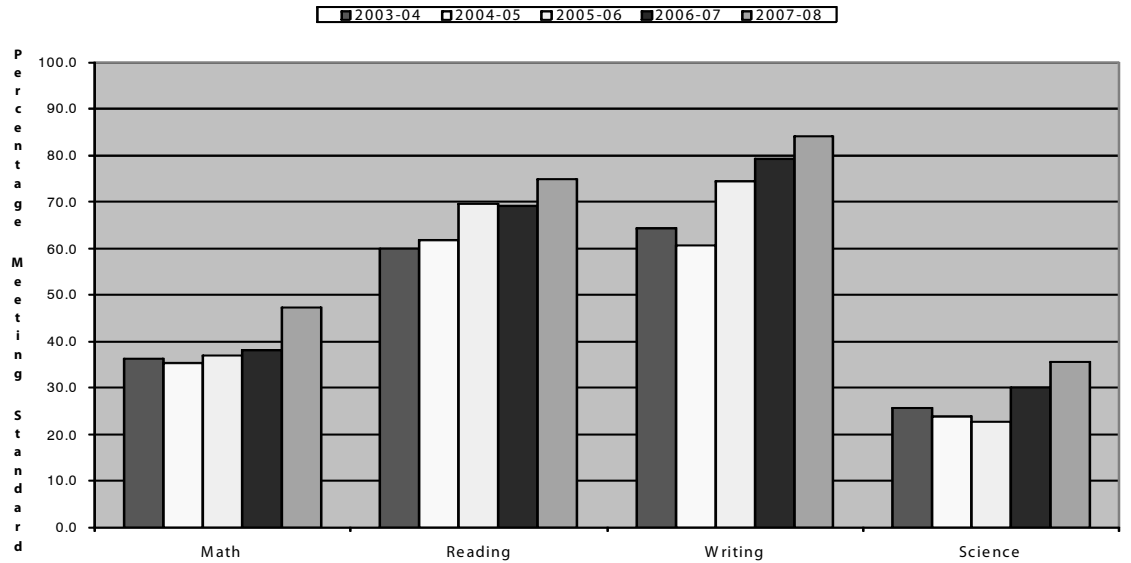

- 2007 graduate George Ftikas was inducted into the Legal Eagles, the student community of the Department of Justice, Law and Society at American University.
- DECA came to FP this year. This club, along with our business alliance class, opened our new student store "The Bird's Nest."
- Our DECA cards competed for the first time in the regional competition, and eight placed, going on to state: Garrett Gunderson & Andrew Soros teamed up

to receive the elusive 1st place in Financial Analysis; Amanda Vishoot took home 3rd in Accounting; Riley Kitchen and Dan Squier received 6th in Buying & Merchandising Management. Austin Olson placed 7th in Automotive Services Marketing; Rachel Wilder 7th in Business Services Marketing; and Danielle Westing 7th in Restaurant & Food Service.

- Our band students participated in the Regional Solo and Ensemble contest held at Bethel High. All individual entrants scored at least an "Excellent" (II) rating, and two received ratings of I: Max Jacobsen, who went on to state, and Grace Pak, who was a first alternate to state. Band director Matt Pelandini says these students rose above and beyond what is expected of them, preparing their music outside of class, presenting themselves professionally at the competition, and representing FP well to the rest of our region.
- Max Jacobsen represented himself and the school extremely well at the State Solo/Ensemble contest in Ellensburg. He received outstanding (near perfect) scores in almost all categories, and from one judge, an

overall rating of 1 (considered "most musical artistry expected from any high school student").

- FP baseball players Kevin Whitehead and Erich Armstrong were selected to the All-Area baseball team by the Tacoma News Tribune, and Kevin, Erich and Brooks Roy made the SPSL All-League 1st team.
- In the spring, our band received an "Excellent" rating from three very tough judges at the regional Band Contest at Graham-Kapowsin HS. Our band students thoroughly enjoyed their clinic with Larry Gookin of CWU, and were able to hear some wonderful bands including Spanaway Lake, Curtis, and Graham Kapowsin.
- The journalism and yearbook staffs attended the JEA National Convention in Anaheim, CA. Four FP students brought home awards: Elise Utterback received a "Superior" in the category Yearbook Copy/Caption: Sports; Amy Ohlinger took an "Excellent" in Newspaper News/Feature Photography; and Zach Newman (Broadcast Newswriting) and Kristen Larkin (Advertising Design) brought back Honorable Mentions.

- The 2007-08 Cardinal Newspaper staff for took home Best of Show 1st Runner Up at State competition! The staff submitted the November 2007 issue of the Cardinal. Dan Woods, Ashley Drowatzky, James Fisher and Amy Ohlinger also won individual Honorable Mentions for their work.

- Senior Janice Rim was selected as a Washington Scholar. This award comes with a scholarship for full tuition for 4 years at any Washington University. Janice was one of 147 students across the state selected for the award.
- The FPHS Concert and Symphonic Bands (known together as the "Cardinal Band") participated at the CWU Wind Ensemble Festival. It is the largest festival of its kind in the state. The students performed two pieces of music especially put together for this event and received many compliments, including "I had no idea the band was doing so well!", "I wasn't expecting that!", and "Your band is AWESOME!"
- The Franklin Pierce Special Olympics Basketball Team won the State Championship in Wentachee/Leavenworth. Taking home the gold medal were Jacob Hartson, Wyatt Jones, Joshua Moldskred (Ford Middle School), Zachary Slotnick, and Greg Whitbeck.
- The FP Jazz Band participated at the Edmonds Community College Jazz Festival. We received high praise from the adjudicators and three students received "Outstanding Musicianship" Awards: Leif Gustafson, Max Jacobsen, and Trish Wells.
